Bullitt County,

On the 15th day of October 1832
Personally appeared in open Court before the Justice
of Bullitt County now sitting Augustus Webb
a Resident of Bullitt County in the State of
Kentucky aged twenty seven years who being first
duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath
make the following Declaration in order to
obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress
passed June 7th 1832 That he entered the
Service of the United States under the follow-
ing named Officers and Service as therein
stated. There was a Company of Militia raised
in Albemarle County Virginia under the Command
of Capt Lewis which was styled &
Called Minute men and in the year 1775 or
1776 as well as the now recollect said Company
with others were ordered to march under the
Command of Col^o Andrew Lewis against Gov-
ernor Dunmore who was with his Shipping
at Swains Island. Our John Clark who was
first Sergeant of Capt Lewis's Company was
unable to leave home and I went out as
his Substitute & received the appointment of
first Sergeant. We marched to Swains
Island (distant from Albemarle County about
Eighty or ninety miles) and on our arrival
Governor Dunmore went on Board of his
Vessels & sailed off. and we returned home
and shortly afterwards the said Company with
others was ordered to march under the Com-
mand of Col^o William Christian against
the Cherokee Indians. We commenced our
march thro' by Holston French Broad &c &
got within a short distance of the Indian towns
and was met by a party of Indians who sued

for peace and rest. Christian held a Council
with them after which he returned home & was
discharged. He served between seven & eight
months in the Expeditions against Danmore
and the Cherokee Indians. Some time after
this return home he moved to Bolling County
Virginia and in the month of October in the
year 1781 at a muster of the Militia of
said County Col. Skillens of said Militia
urged the men to volunteer their services to
go to Carolina to aid General Greene & Morgan
in the defence of the Country, and Capt. Robert
Robertson of Featherdale and myself volunteered,
the said Robertson as Capt. Leather stated as
Lieutenant himself as Ensign. We immediately
raised a Company and were placed under
the Command of Col. David Campbell and
ordered on to Carolina. We marched commenced
our march in the month of October
marched to Salisbury when we stopped a short
time to draw provisions. From there we marched
to a place called the Cowpens & joined General
David Morgan just before the Battle com-
menced with the British Troops under Earl Cornwallis
and I was in said Battle called the Battle of
the Cowpens in which the British were
defeated. After the Battle General Skutumpah
Spive who was Commander in Chief in the battle
directed General Morgan to send an Express to
General William Campbell on the Holston
directing General Campbell to send him on
some Soldiers and I was appointed to carry
the despatches. I secured them in the pack
of my Saddle but on my route to Holston I
was taken Prisoner by the Forces of Surinam
to be hanged. I was kept tied & guarded
for two days & one night but I made my
Escape & saved my despatches safe to
Campbell. He sent a Company of Soldiers

with me back to the Army. During my absence
on this duty my Company had been discharged &
returned home and on my return to the Army
I was discharged ~~by order~~ by
order of General Morgan and I arrived at home
on the 15th day of April 1782. I have no
documentary evidence in my possession proving
my service to my Country such I know of no
person in Kentucky who can prove it and I
am too old to go to travel to Virginia
in search of proof. I hereby relinquish my
claim whatever to a pension or annuity of either
the present and declare that my name is not on the
Pension Roll of the Agency of any State. In
answer to the Interrogatory propounded by the
Court I answer to the 1st Query born in Hanover
County in the State of Virginia on the 29th day of
August 1755. To the 2^d I answer that when I
saw my love of duty against Governor Dun-
more & the Cherokee Indians I lived in Albemarle
County Virginia, when I entered the service to
go to Carolina I lived in Belltop County
Virginia. In the year 1782 I came to Ken-
tucky I settled near the Fayette County and
I now reside in Belltop County Kentucky. To
the 2^d Interrogatory I answer that I have no
records of my age and only know it from informers
how true I have derived from my father.
To the 4th I answer that when I first went into
service I served as a Substitute for John
Clayton when I entered the Service near Botle
top County I volunteered. To the 5th I answer that
I bore arms with the troops when I
last served. I do not recollect any of the Com-
mand or military Regiments except the Regiments
to which I belonged Commanded by Colo David
Campbell. There were some regular troops near
Green's Island but I do not recollect the names
of the Officers or Regiments. On the Expedition
against the Cherokee Indians there were no

regular Officers or Continental Regiment. I have
already stated the general Circumstances of
my Service. In the 6th January 1781 I arrived
received any written discharge from the Service
I was appointed Ensign in Capt. Roberts's Com-
pany by Col. Skillman but received no
written Commission from any one. To this
of the State that I am known to Jesse Wilson
Mathaniel P. Saunders & sometimes Bogard
of my neighbourhood who can testify as to
my Character for veracity & good behaviour
but there is no Clergyman residing in my neigh-
bourhood. If I was able to travel to the
County of Fayette, Clark & Shelby in the
State (Kentucky) I could procure the Testi-
mony of many persons as to my veracity & good
behaviour but I am too infirm & poor to
do so. Sworn & subscribed to the day &
year aforesaid
